Provide a “best estimate” of unspent funds remaining that will be used during no-cost extension. Note that only a brief justification is requested (note character limits). If financially possible, continue external evaluation during no-cost extension. **NOTE: NSF does not send a notification when a no-cost extension is approved/enacted. You will know when the end-date for your grant changes in the NSF Award System.**

i Reminder: The extension request must be submitted to NSF at least **45 days prior** to the end date of the grant.
