### Culturally Responsive Education



Culturally Responsive Education for Advanced Technician Educators (CREATE) is a professional development series that guides STEM educators in developing beliefs and competencies that are culturally responsive.

Culturally responsive approaches use the cultural knowledge, prior experiences, frames of reference, and performance styles of ethnically diverse students to make learning encounters more relevant and effective for them (Geneva Gay, 2013).

### Asset versus Deficit: Educational Context



	Deficit Orientation	Asset Orientation
definition fa co th in a	Explains educational disparities by placing ault on the students' personhood, communities, backgrounds and families herefore assuming the solutions for mprovement or reform are beyond teachers' and school systems' control and influence – Scott et al. p.414, 2015)	Values strength, resilience, and assets. Shifts lens towards assets that are often hidden or taken for granted in hegemonic framework of imperialist, white supremacist, cis-gendered, heteronormative patriarchy – (Morrison, p. 191, 2017)
_	Thinking about a social group in terms of what hey lack, e.g. literacy, preparation, knowledge	Thinking about people in terms of their strengths, and how they can lead to success
	Fix deficit at the student level to resemble model social group.	Places necessity of change on the institution and educators to harness students' assets and create an environment that fosters reproducible success
•	earn a new skill, behavior, meet a standard. AP testing, SATs, Remedial Math	The concept of balance is widely adopted among Native Americans as a basis for scientific understanding
